Academic and Assessment Information:

Leave of Absence or deferments by students must conform to the visa regulations under which the student was admitted into the course.

Students who have completed Module A only:

- Can defer for up to 10 weeks before commencing Module B.
- In case of deferment of between 6 and 15 weeks the student will be required to repeat Module A.
- > In the case of longer deferment, the students will be required to re-sit the placement test.

A student who has completed module A and B but not achieved:

- May defer up to 5 weeks and be permitted to repeat one 5-week module (either A or B at the Deputy Director's discretion and teacher recommendation). At the end of this module they will re-test.
- In the event of deferment between 6 and 15 weeks, the non-achieving student will be required to complete both module A and B.
- > Leave of absence

To apply for leave of absence, you must show that you have "compassionate or compelling" circumstances.

Taking a leave of absence may affect your visa. Please contact DIBP for information about your visa before submitting a leave of absence application. Compassionate or compelling circumstances that may require a student to take a Leave of Absence include, but are not limited to, the following:

Illness or injury

Evidence required: medical certificate which states the student was/is unable to attend classes for an extended period of time or recommends a reduced study load or break from study

Bereavement of close family members

> Evidence required: death certificates and evidence of relationship

Major political upheaval or natural disaster in the home country which has impacted on the student's ability to study

Evidence required: media reports of civil war/significant political unrest or natural disaster plus evidence of student's residency in the specific affected area, and letter from counsellor/psychologist assessing that stress has/will prevent student from studying

Permanent or temporary disability.

Evidence required: letter from RMIT Disability Liaison Unit recommending a reduced study load or a break from study

Incident or issue causing distress to student impacting on their capacity for study e.g, involvement in a serious accident, witnessing or being the victim of a serious crime

> Evidence required: police or counsellor/psychologists' reports

Delay in receiving a student visa requiring student to travel offshore

Evidence required: correspondence from DIAC

Military Service obligations

Evidence required: Correspondence from military organisation

Other

Evidence required: any relevant certified document attesting that situation is outside student's control and affects their ability to study.

Please note that an inability to pay tuition fees alone is not considered a compassionate/compelling circumstance for international student visa holder. It is a condition of your student visa to have sufficient funds for study and living purposes.
