

he *Women Researchers' Network* held their annual symposium at RMIT University, inviting research and academic staff to participate in a day filled with networking opportunities and a range of presentations from highly-regarded guest speakers.

The focus of 2018 was 'Engagement = Empowerment', encouraging attendees to continue advocating for change and to foster supportive environments for women researchers. The audience was delighted to hear inspiring words from Rebecca Scott, CEO and co-founder of STREAT - a social enterprise that addresses youth homelessness through hospitality projects. She delivered a powerful talk centred around the idea that disbelief creates a range of emotions - anger, wonder and awe - that drives the desire to fix the "broken things" in the world. Rebecca endorsed that the "hairline fractures", the side-projects and the "work in the cracks" that women are continually doing are needed to lead change and discovery.

Women's rights advocate Faduma Musse sat down with Dr Margaret Heffernan OAM to share inspirational insight on the need to empower women and develop leaders in the community. Faduma has spent years working with government, business, community groups and health agencies to stand against female genital mutilation and shift entrenched cultural values. She left us with the reminder that "change can be slow, but patience is the most important factor in engaging with the community."

Dr Leonora Risse and Professor Lisa Farrell each highlighted the need for women to be a voice - to use perspective, personal values, wisdom and experiences to shape a range of life outcomes. Following, Associate Professor Madhu Bhaskaran challenged the audience throughout her talk to work hard, rely on teams effectively and to "say yes to everything, so that you know what to say no to later."

A panel of accomplished women researchers later discussed Impact Realities, drawing on experiences in their respective fields to share anecdotes, practical advice and encouraging words. Each panel member presented their thoughts on 'impact', covering areas of change, community, conversation, difference, connection and relationships.

Rounding out a fantastic line-up of guest speakers, Professor Karen Becker from the University of the Sunshine Coast delivered a brilliant keynote speech that reminded us to empower colleagues, students, community and ourselves, as it has the ability to create strong, controlled and uplifted people.




